



Seeds for the Journey

In my CRS Rice Bowl homily on the first Sunday of Lent I introduced you to a woman in Uganda by the name of Specioza, a recipient of a CRS program geared towards reuniting orphaned children with their biological families. Specioza expressed her gratefulness for the assistance given by CRS stating, "I have happiness in my heart." But Specioza is not alone in her efforts to raise her once orphaned granddaughter. She has support both from her daughters and from two neighbors. These individuals have had their own family problems and have benefited greatly from the CRS orphan reunification training program. I'd like you to meet three of them who spoke to us

through an interpreter.



Peace, a neighbor of Specioza, has three children of her own and assists in raising five others. Peace stated that because of CRS she is now handling her children better, she no longer beats them. She told us that she has learned how to let go of stressful situations and to better handle her problems.

Pauline, also a neighbor, has two children of her own and watches over two others. She said she spent six months in the training program which taught her how to praise her children and give them rewards when they do something good. She has also learned how to make a timetable to help her plan for the day, which makes her day less stressful.

Ferida is Specioza's Muslim granddaughter. She has seven children of her own. She told us that before the training taking care of her children involved much shouting and violence. Now she can talk with and praise her children and guard against anger. She confided with us that her husband previously beat her. However, after talking him into letting her go through the program her husband is now supportive. She said her husband is very happy to finally see her kids behaving and no longer beats her or them. Farida now starts each day with a kind greeting to her children, who have started to respond.

What these stories all have in common is the tragedy of domestic violence that is prevalent in rural farming areas of Uganda. Domestic violence is one of the underlying causes of generational poverty, sex trafficking, and teenage marriages, often involving older men who may already have several wives. The CRS program known as SOCY (Sustainable Outcome for Children and Youth), which provides training in areas such as parenting, communication, HIV awareness, education, and financial matters, has significantly reduced the incidents of domestic violence and has opened the door to a much brighter future for thousands of young girls and their families. Your support of CRS (Rice Bowl, CRS Collection) makes such success stories possible.

On this Palm Sunday I want to thank you on behalf of CRS for your continued willingness to serve the needs of your brothers and sisters around the world. May our celebration of Holy Week unfold for us the mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection and enable us to experience, in a very real way, our own dying and rising in Him, with Him, and through Him.





Limbaugh, David Jesus on Trial (A Lawyer Affirms the Truth of the Gospel)
