



- Confirmation Preparation is a two year process throughout the Diocese of Rochester.
- Registered students begin preparation for Confirmation no earlier than eighth grade.
- Classes are at St. Paul's on Sunday mornings, from September to May.

Year 1: 9:30 to 10:50 a.m. (with the exception of guest speakers/retreats/ group service)

Year 2: 12:10-1:30 p.m. (with the exception of guest speakers/retreats/group service)

- Cost: \$50 per year (fee includes materials, speaker fees, retreat cost)
- \$20 for First Penance Preparation if child has not received Frist Penance

JUST A FEW WEEKS AWAY! St. Paul's School of Awesome Religion

SOAR classes begin on Sunday, September 15th and Monday, September 16th for the 2019-2020 school year. **There will not be classes held on Tuesday night this year.** Things to know:

- Children who attended last year in grades 1-4 will automatically be re-registered for the next grade, same day and time (except all Sunday classes are at 10:00 a.m.) You will be receiving a billing statement in the mail.
- Children who attended Tuesday night will be moved to Monday night. If this does not work for your family, please call Sue (671-2110) to discuss other options. You will also be receiving a billing statement in the mail.
- Children entering Pre-K, Kindergarten, and first grade will need to be registered for the first time. Please go to our website *stpaulsrcc.org* to register and pay online. Just click the Faith Formation tab, followed by the SOAR tab.
- You must be a registered parishioner to attend SOAR classes. To register, please call the parish office at 671-2100.

This weekend our parish participates in the Rochester Diocesan Mission Cooperative Plan. We welcome Fr. Robert Bradler, Diocesan Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith as our mission speaker on behalf of Hands Together.

The Church in Haiti is struggling to bring God's love to the poorest of the poor. In Haiti there are 7 million people in an area smaller than Maryland. 70% of these cannot read, and 85% live below the poverty level. In slum areas 4 out of 5 children do not reach the age of five, and nationally 1 in 3 suffer from chronic malnutrition. The hurricanes in 2004 and 2008, along with the devastating January 12, 2010 earthquake, have left Haiti severely damaged and in desperate need of our prayers and support.
