



- Funeral Ministry: Consists of greeters, ushers, sacristans and Acolytes to help during the funeral or Memorial Mass. Coordinator: Bonnie Serio
- Gardening Angels: Keep the compound of St. Paul's beautiful in the spring and summer with various duties of weeding, planting etc. Coordinator: Ben O'Brien
- **Good Sam Outreach:** Creates opportunities for the parish to assist those with social justice concerns with hunger relief and homelessness and human development. **Coordinator: DA Hutnick**
- Greeters: Are a welcoming friendly face to Mass attendees and handing out bulletins at the end of Mass. Coordinators: Forest & Julie Shick
- John Walsh Library: Our volunteers add books to the collection, place featured books on the cart, reshelve returned books, write articles for the bulletin and upkeep organization of the books.

- Lectors: Proclaim the Word of God during Mass and other liturgies. Coordinator: Laure Barr
- Linens: Assist with washing and ironing of the towels that are used during Mass. Coordinator: Helen Stirpe
- Marthas Ministry: Host receptions in the parish hall following funeral and memorial Masses. Marthas also assist with parish celebrations, special events. Coordinators: DA Hutnick & Bonnie Epner
- OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): A program designed to educate adults who are interested in joining the Catholic Church. Coordinators: Anselm Mesue & Deacon Mark Robbins
- Our Lady of Compassion Homebound/Nursing Home Ministry: a group of volunteers who visit people in their homes or in nursing homes to provide Holy Communion and social interaction. Coordinator: Fr. Paul
- Parish Pastoral Council: An advisory committee that supports Fr. Paul and the parish community in planning events such as the annual parish picnic. Chairperson: Patrice DeAngelis
- **Prayer Shawl:** Knits or crochets prayers shawls, lap robes baptismal blankets that are distributed to those who are sick, grieving, or being baptized. **Coordinator: Cathy Reetz**
- Sacristans: A behind the scenes way to participate in the Mass by setting up the items needed for Mass, and cleaning and put away the items after Mass. Coordinator: Jane Adams
- **Stream Team:** Live stream Mass and special liturgies along with adding readings, hymns etc. to the TV screens for congregation. **Coordinator: Tom Napoli**
- **Ushers:** Assist with seating, presentation gifts during offertory, sometimes carry the cross in procession, assist with collection etc. **Coordinator: Jodie Hickey**
- Vac Pac: Keep our worship area and common areas clean and tidy by vacuuming, sweeping etc. Coordinator: Jodie Hickey

Adult Faith Formation Opportunities

Adult Faith Formation Catechesis "The Wisdom of the Long Journey: The Elderly & Family Life"

All are welcome to join us on Thursday, December 5 at 6:30 p.m. in the worship area. Our guest speaker, Fr. John Mack has a Masters degree in theology and a Licentiate of Sacred Theology (STL). He currently serves as the priest Chaplain of the Aquinas Institute. He has been ordained nearly 40 years for the Diocese of Buffalo. Retired from active ministry, he resides in his family home in Rochester, working part-time at Aguinas and occasionally helping at the Catholic Newman Community, University of Rochester. The past 15 years of ministry, Fr. Mack has participated in the initial priestly formation program for seminarians at Christ the King Seminary, East Aurora and Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology, Hales Corners, WI. He has taught in two Catholic High Schools and has twice served as a pastor in diocesan parishes. Fr. Mack is a liver transplant recipient (30 June 2020) from a living donor (former parishioner) and is a volunteer for the Friends of Strong Liver and Kidney Transplant patient visitors.


From the John Walsh Library

Barron, Robert <u>The Strangest Way</u> (Walking the Christian Way)

Robert Barron, professor of theology at Mundelein Seminary, was blown away when he began to read the mystics, saints, and scholars of the classic Christian tradition. It was certainly not the relatively bland, easy to grasp, unthreatening Christianity that he had been initiated into. It seemed to him the strangest and most exotic of all religious paths he had encountered. At the center was God who comes after us with reckless abandon. This Christianity is a singular way of life, and offers three paths that we must walk. The first path is finding the center with the whole self—praying, breathing, fingering beads, walking processing, pilgrimaging, and fasting our way. The second path is knowing we are sinners. People who can acknowledge their sins are at least to some degree participating in the center. They are in a word, saints. Walking the third path means realizing our life is not about us. We are "hanging in the balance of a perfect finished plan..." (Bob Dylan). Call No. 248.4-BAR)

Make a Gift to the CMA from Your IRA A Special Opportunity if You are 70-1/2 or Older

You can give any amount (up to \$105,000 per year) from your IRA directly to the CMA without having to pay taxes on the amount given as a part of your annual income. Gifts of any value less that \$105,000 or less are eligible for this benefit and you are making a difference for the Diocese of Rochester and your parish. This popular gift option is commonly called the **charitable IRA rollover**, but you may also see it referred to as a **qualified charitable distribution** (QCD). Your disbursement must come directly from the administrator of your IRA to the Diocese - you should not receive the funds first.


