



Thank You to St. Paul parishioners who donated to the K of C "Coats for Kids" ministry. Once again Trinity Council #4618, raised more than the last year, or any previous year since we started this program 9 years ago. Your donations helped enable our council to purchase a record, **34** dozen, **408** NEW children's winter coats! We have come a long way since 2012 when we distributed just 72 coats.

The new coats were distributed over the first week of December to 20 charitable organizations and school districts, who helped identify children as having a true need for a warm coat.
