



Our Advent time of waiting in joyful hope includes preparing for Christmas Masses. Thank you in advance for your patience and understanding of the logistical challenges. While recognizing that the 3 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass is the most convenient for many of you, we ask that you prayerfully consider attending at 5:30 p.m. or 10 a.m. on Christmas Day instead. Those masses are much less crowded, and you will have an easier time finding seats together with your family. As in the past, we are asking that you not send someone in advance to reserve seats. There will be ushers on hand to assist any parishioners and visitors with walkers, wheelchairs, or special needs.

Downstairs Seating

In order to accommodate the larger-than-usual crowds, we will broadcast the 3 p.m. and if needed the 5:30 p.m. Christmas Eve masses on the large screen televisions downstairs in the Parish Hall and in Rooms 7 and 8. Eucharist will be carried to those seated downstairs, and there will be bulletins and worship aids provided so everyone can participate fully in the prayers, responses, and songs. Thank you for your cooperation as we celebrate the birth of our Savior.

Did You Know??

The tax law allows individuals who are 70 ½ and older to make contributions directly from their individual retirement account (IRA) to a qualified charity. 

Have You Read...

O'Malley, S.J., William J. **Being There** (The Parables of Jesus in a Different Voice)

Since the time of the caves, people have used stories or parables to teach valuable lessons. Like the original parables, the versions in this book, told in a contemporary voice, were designed to unsettle. Our familiarity with the original stories sometimes causes us to overlook the uncomfortable truths that Jesus was teaching ("You mean we have to love our neighbor, even the one we detest?"). Father O'Malley amplifies each story with new language and additional context. It is not just a retelling of the familiar stories; he gives the characters names, flesh, and story details He follows each story with "Thoughts to Ponder" which avoid the easy clichés: we learn the Pharisees were not all conniving villains; the father of the Prodigal Son bore some responsibility for what happened; the first shall be last but they will still get in.
