





# Pope John Paul II <u>A Life in Prayer</u>

## (The Private Prayers of Pope John Paul II)

This collection of prayers and public speeches shows the Pope's devotion to the Virgin Mary, reveals the foundations of his spiritual life and the range of his compassion, and the poetry of his language. It delivers an inspirational message of hope, faith , forgiveness, and comfort, perfect for Advent reflection. Born near Krakow in 1920, he was the first non-Italian Pope in more than 450 years when he was elected Pope in 1978. Often outspoken, he became one of the best-known figures in the world as the Cold War drew to an end. In his Christmas message of 2002, he wrote "From the cave of Bethlehem, there arises today an urgent appeal. . . to believers of all religions, together with all men and women of good will, to build peace by outlawing all forms of intolerance and discrimination." 

#### Advent



The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin word, adventus, meaning coming or arrival. There is beautiful symbolism to the Advent wreath. It's circle shape has no beginning and no end, which signifies God's unending presence and infinite love for us. The evergreens symbolize the promise of eternal life we received through the sacrifice of Christ. Holly greens added can also signify immortality, and pinecones are a symbol of life and resurrection. The Advent candles represent the light of Christ in our world. The four candles stand for the four week's themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Purple candles on the 1,2, and 4th week remind us that Advent is a time of prayer, penance and sacrifice, while the 3rd week's pink candle marks the joy we feel in anticipation of Christmas drawing near.
