



Seeds for the Journey

Mary, Our Mother

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family this weekend, may we stop for a while to contemplate one member in particular—*Mary*. The Catholic resource organization *Dynamic Catholic* has described Mary as the most famous woman in history, inspiring more art and music than any other woman who has lived. She has captured the imaginations of men and women of all faiths, even appearing on the cover of *Time* magazine more than any other person!

During the Advent and Christmas seasons we bump into Mary everywhere: we acknowledge her Immaculate Conception on December 8th; honor her gift of mercy and compassion as Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12th; celebrate the birth of her son and God's on December 25th; pay homage to the entire Holy Family on December 29th; recognize her as the Holy Mother of God on January 1st; and commemorate the visitation of the magi to her newborn son on January 6th.

We experience Mary during many of the critical times in the life of Jesus. It was *she* who coached *him* to perform his first miracle—the changing of water into wine at the marriage at Cana. Bowed beneath the weight of his cross, Jesus encountered his mother on the way to Calvary. While hanging on that cross, he entrusted his disciple John to his mother, and vice versa. We find Mary still at the foot of the cross when Jesus dies (the other disciples have scattered in fear), and after Jesus' ascension, Mary is among those who gather in the upper room.

These are big, swooping events, and in the face of them, along with the miraculous appearances of Mary throughout history, we can forget that she is in fact simply our mother. *Mary is very simply our mother*, and like every mother she is interested in the details of our lives and wants them to work out. When we invite her to get involved in the little matters of our lives, she enters with gusto and makes herself—and God's will—unmistakably known!

Here's one little example: As I mentioned previously, I was raised in another Christian tradition, and in that tradition we were taught that Mary was simply a random Jewish girl whom God favored with the mother-hood of His son. We do not pray to her, as that would be idolatry, and she is not a saint, as no one but Jesus was saintly. Then, during one Easter vacation when I was a teenager, I watched a movie on Our Lady of Fatima at a Catholic friend's house. I was mesmerized. I knew in the depth of my heart that everything I had just seen was absolutely true. I knew Mary was much more than a random girl and that her love and presence were accessible to us. I started praying to Mary, and over many years of speaking to her often, I came to know her and even rely on her as a loving, maternal presence who seemed to care deeply about how I was living my life. (I was not Catholic during this time.)

Then during the late 1980s I returned to Buffalo after living and teaching English in California for many years. I was looking for another position but not having much success. When I began praying fervently to Mary I was struck with the thought that I should see if Mary had a school dedicated to her. I checked the Yellow Pages (dating myself here) and found St. Mary's High School! When I called, the Assistant Principal told me that yes, they had an opening for an English teacher but they had just filled it. Would I like to offer my name and number as a substitute teacher? Yes, I would. The next day he called and said that after speaking with me something told him that before offering the position to the other person, he should at least meet me and speak with me. Would I agree to do this without any guarantee of a job? Yes, I would. We met and talked and got on quite well, and then he said, "I've never done this before, but I feel very strongly that you should be our English teacher. Would you like the job?" Yes, I would!

Mary, our Mother, never fails to enter even the most mundane of our life experiences to keep us on the path of our Father's will.

Coffey, Kathy Experiencing God with Your Children

On this feast of the Holy Family, a reminder that the John Walsh Library has many books about family life and parenting. In this book, Kathy Coffey recounts the reverence and the hilarity her family found as they searched for God with their children. They discovered God in cars, concert halls, beaches, and dentists' offices. She admits frustration at long, formal prayers offered by people with no understanding of the short attention span of hungry children. "At one end of the dinner table is a sixteen-year-old keeling over with boredom, while at the other end is a two-year-old sticking French fries up her nose." The idea that parenting doesn't have to be perfect, but simply "good enough" can bring tremendous relief to many overwhelmed parents. 
