



Jesus, Mary and Joseph

The entire Church today celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family. This celebration is very fitting during this Christmas season. Today is the fifth Day in the Octave of Christmas. The primary purpose of the Church in instituting and promoting this feast is to present the Holy Family as a model and exemplar of all Christian families. The Holy Family as you are aware, comprises of our Redeemer Jesus, his mother Mary, who conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and his foster Father, Joseph. Jesus, the Word Made Flesh, the Son of God who became man for our salvation remains the central figure. Mary, his mother according to His human nature is titled mother of God because her son is Divine. Joseph who was not his biological father, was guided by an angel to assume the responsibilities of fatherhood. He performed the role of what Pope John Paul II described as "custodian of the Redeemer."

We do not know much about the early life of Jesus. Scripture tells us about the flight to Egypt when Herod wanted to kill Jesus, the return to Nazareth and the incidents that occurred when the twelveyear-old Jesus accompanied his parents to the Temple in Jerusalem. Today's Gospel text tells us about the latter. When his parents were on their way back to Jerusalem, the boy Jesus, remained in Jerusalem but his parents did not know it. They returned to Jerusalem to look for him, and found him in the Temple after three days, sitting in the midst of his teachers who were astounded at his understanding and answers. The gospel tells us that Jesus went to Nazareth with his parents and was obedient to them.

Through this feast, Children could see in their father, Joseph who took great care of Jesus and guided him in life. They should see our Blessed Mother, Mary, as the perfect model for their own Mother. Children must learn how to obey and to love their parents in thought, word, and action, just as Jesus was obedient to Mary and Joseph.

In his General Audience of December 28, 2011, Feast of the Holy Family, Pope Benedict XVI said the following: "the house of Nazareth is a school of prayer where one learns to listen, meditate on and penetrate the profound meaning of the manifestation of the Son of God, following the example of Mary, Joseph and Jesus." As Christians, we are encouraged daily to pray as a family. Catholic parents have a responsibility to introduce their kids and grandkids to a life of prayer and to have a relationship with God. In his Apostolic Exhortation on the Family, *Familiaris Consortio*, Pope Saint John Paul II describes the family as a Domestic Church in which the child is introduced into God's family through Baptism and education in the faith. He identified four broad roles of the family:

- Formation of a community of persons
- Serving Life
- Participating in the Development of Society
- Sharing in the life and Mission of the Church


The Christian family is a believing and evangelizing community. It is a community in dialogue with God, achieved through family prayer. A family that prays together, satays together.

Oliver, Mary <u>Devotions</u>

(The Selected Poems of Mary Oliver)



As Father Martin said in Learning to Pray (reviewed previously), there are many ways to pray. Reading and reflecting on the poems of Mary Oliver, a well-known and beloved poet, could be one way. Her poems reflect her love of the physical world and the bonds that connect all living things. The sound of a wren singing fills her with wonder. "What could this be if it isn't a prayer?" When hearing the biblical story about Christmas night, she thinks about the unheralded participants. "On the outskirts of Jerusalem, the donkey waited, not especially brave or filled with un-

derstanding. I hope finally he loved the man who rode so lightly upon him, as he lifted one dusty hoof and stepped, as he had to, forward. Like Father Martin, she also has advice about praying. "Patch a few words together and don't try to make them elaborate. This isn't a contest, but the doorway into thanks and into a silence into which another voice may speak." She has advice for all of us: "Instructions for living a life: Pay attention. Be astonished. Tell about it." (Call No. 811.54-OLI)
