Seeds for the Journey LENT prayer • fasting • almsgiving

The **human history of salvation** is a story of God's love to His people. He **created** human beings in His image and likeness out of love. Unfortunately, the devil's temptation caused humankind to sin and to **fall** from God's grace. God didn't give up on human beings as he promised redemption saying to Satan, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; He will strike at your head" (Genesis 3:15). The **Incarnation** - birth of Jesus, the offspring of the woman named Mary was to fulfill this promise. Jesus was born to save the humankind through the **Paschal Mystery** - passion, death and resurrection.

Jesus spent time in the desert to prepare for His ministry that culminated with the Paschal Mystery. The church gives us the Lenten season to journey with Christ into the desert and be ready for the upcoming Paschal celebrations. To prepare ourselves, Jesus asks us to repent and focus on the spiritual disciplines of **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving**. These will help us to defeat the devil's temptations as Jesus said, "Only prayer and fasting can force out these kind of demons" (Mk 9:28-29, Mt 17:19-21). We therefore need to spend more time in prayer especially the rosary. Try attending mass on weekend and weekdays, Adoration of Most Blessed Sacrament on Wednesdays or have a special retreat or a recollection day this Lent. Read a spiritual book or have Lectio Divina on the Scriptures.

Fasting and abstaining helps us to sacrifice and give alms. We can fast and abstain not only from food but also from negative activities or habits. Every time we put off the cellphone and take off an evening from TV and computer screens, we are telling God, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening." Every time we fast from food or abstain from meat and that dessert, we are emptying ourselves of our desires and letting God to fill us up. These denials give us a chance to give money to the church and help the poor through CRS and Good Sam Outreach. The acts of charity teach us detachment. The more we detach ourselves from material things, the more we discover that we are made for the kingdom of God. May we have a blessed Lent to prepare for the upcoming Paschal celebrations and be ready for **Parousia** - Jesus' second coming to take us to heaven to share in His glory of resurrection.

How does Tom select the music in this no-singing time? As always, it beings with the scripture readings for that particular Sunday: Epistle, Gospel, Psalms for the entrance rite, Psalms for the responsorial psalm, Psalms for the offertory, and Psalms for Communion. From these readings I abstract the Themes: (for example) the themes for the second Sunday of Lent are: prefigured glory, heaven, holiness, hope. Then I attempt to find settings of hymns or sacred music that reflect these themes. In searching I always attempt to find setting of hymns or anthems that you know or at least have heard. Finally, I select organ and or piano works from the vast literature of sacred music to fill out the list. This is basically a liturgical undertaking to support the Mass of that particular day and not merely entertainment.


Prayer to Begin CRS Rice Bowl
