

A Gift of our Diocese: Sharing our Resources

Our Patron St. Paul wrote to the people in Corinth, about the Body of Christ, the Church (Cor:12:12-27): "The body is one and has many members, but all the members, many though are, are one body; and so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body,... If (one) part suffers, all the parts suffer with it: if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy. You then are the body of Christ. **Every one** is a member of it." This is at the heart of the Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA).

Our St. Paul parish by itself could not fund the ministries that our parish staff and parishioners benefits from such as the IT department helps us with computer programs as well who that visit the sick, give Holy Communion and Anointing of the Sick to parishioners who are at area hospitals; the programs for young people, including campus ministry at colleges, (such as M.C.C., Geneseo, the University of Rochester, and R.I.T.); the resources for couples preparing for marriage, such as Pre-Cana; the work of Catholic Charities which not only helps the poor and those in need in our Diocese but oversees such programs as Operation Rice Bowl, hurricane relief, and raising awareness around issues of justice and Respect Life; the vocation office which has helped facilitate new candidates who wish to study for the priesthood for the service of our Diocese of Rochester; the Bishop's Office which includes Bishop Matano (and his predecessors) assigning priests and deacons to provide pastoral care for the people of our St. Paul parish for many years. The Bishop has also been available for Confirmation, the Rite of Election, the "Hands of Christ" Recognition and the annual Marriage Anniversary Celebrations.

We as a parish do not exist without the Diocese. All the people in our parish area who have been comforted at our funerals, strengthened when sick in the hospital, nursing homes, hospice or at home, encouraged when receiving baptism or the sacrament of marriage, or helped in so many other ways, have been ministered to by the extension of Bishop and our Diocese. No matter where we are located, we are part of the Body of Christ, which St. Paul writes about, in the above passage. So, we can never talk about the "diocese" as "out there" some place. We are the Diocese of Rochester.

We are all connected parts. St. Paul knew, what hopefully we too realize today, that it is only by pooling our resources and together helping one another out, that we can accomplish so much collectively, what we can't do as a single individual or a standalone parish; because we are "Christ our Light." One way we can reflect and live out this reality is by contributing generously to this year's CMA. Every gift is needed and important. Thank you for your continued support to our Diocese and St. Paul's parish.
