

Seeds for the Journey

When can we do away with masks? When can we return to singing? When can we offer one another a sign of peace? Will our SOAR children have in-person classes this fall? Will we have coffee and doughnuts on Sunday morning again? When will the library be opened? These, and many more, are questions that many are asking as the urgency of the COVID pandemic continues to diminish. Some of these may already have been answered by the time of this writing; others may take more time for us to address. But as we anxiously await a return to a more "normal" parish life there are more pressing questions that I think we should be asking ourselves.

It goes without saying, I think, that the COVID pandemic has changed our lives, our communities, our way of being. We view the world through a different lens than we did just a year ago. As Catholics the pandemic changed the way we celebrate, interact, and worship. It affected attendance, staffing, and our finances. At the same time we learned new things, added new technology, found new ways to reach others, etc. As parish leaders consider how best to integrate the many changes we've experienced into parish life, I think we all need to take time to reflect on what we've experienced on a personal level, and try to discern what God is speaking to us as we move forward into a new reality. To that end, I invite you to take some quiet time, both alone and with family and friends, to prayerfully reflect on the following:

- 1. What changes did the COVID pandemic bring into your life? How did you manage those changes?
- 2. What have you lost or gained (materially, emotionally, spiritually) during the crisis?
- 3. Try to verbalize the suffering you may have experienced; illness, the death of a loved one, the loss of a job, loneliness, isolation, etc.
- 4. What have been your greatest challenges? How have you managed them?
- 5. What did you miss or have you missed the most? Why?
- 6. What are your thoughts about the way the pandemic has been handled, nationally and locally?
- 7. What do you fear the most moving forward?
- 8. What, if anything, do you see as a positive outcome moving forward?
- 9. Name something new that will continue to be a part of your life.
- 10. What new awareness, appreciation, lessons, or thankfulness have you experienced?
- 11. Where do you see God in all of this?
- 12. What has been your experience of prayer, faith, doubt, and wonder over the past fifteen months?

No doubt as you reflect on the above questions, others will arise. The idea is to reflect openly about what you've experienced, how your life has changed, how you see yourself integrating/managing those changes, and where God is leading you moving forward. If you are doing this reflection as a family, it's important to engage children as much as possible, encourage and allow them to express their thoughts and emotions, and listen to them intently.

Most importantly, invite God into the process. Invoke the presence of the Holy Spirit as you begin. Ask for healing, forgiveness, understanding, wisdom, and peace during every point of your reflection and discussions. End your reflection with a prayer of thanksgiving, while seeking God's vision moving forward.

Let us pray:

Gracious and loving God, even as we free ourselves of the masks that cover our faces, you see the masks that still cover our hearts. You know of our suffering, our grief, our frustration, and our pain. In your mercy set us free from the burdens that weigh on us, heal our physical wounds as well as the wounds of our hearts, and help us to see the goodness of your presence in all that we've experienced during this pandemic. As you guide us with your light help us to see our way forward with open minds and grateful hearts. We ask this through Christ our Lord.






