

Heavenly Father,


Thank You for Your amazing power and work in our lives.

Confession Procedure

In the past during the confession hour a person would enter the Worship space and notice that the Confessional door was closed, signaling that someone was already in for confession. They would wait in the Worship space until it was their turn.

Then there was the shutdown.

After St. Paul's re-opened, the Confessional was moved into the Chapel. There was more space for placing 2 chairs, a kneeler, a screen and to maintain distancing. Taking into consideration that there is not a door to close for the new Confessional, it is important to keep the doors entering the Worship space closed during a confession. There has been a staff person in the Narthex to monitor and guide people during this time.

This procedure is being updated.

The confessional remains in the chapel with no door. However, on the door entering the Worship space:

- A RED sign will signal when a confession is in session and that they should wait in the Narthex.
- A **GREEN** sign will signal when the Confessional is available and then to enter.

The person would turn the sign to **RED** when going in for confession and then back to **GREEN** when leaving. This way the next person waiting in the Narthex would know when it is their turn. Fr. Paul will be waiting!!
