

Seeds for the Journey

It is a happy occasion for me to be writing this article for the Sunday when we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ! As a convert to Catholicism, I am always most grateful that we have in our tradition an offering of the very essence of Jesus Christ, by whom we are transformed and brought into union with the Father—just as Jesus requested when he prayed for his disciples—present and to come—at the Last Supper. There will be public processions all across the world today, where the Blessed Sacrament, encased in a monstrance, will be carried through neighborhood streets as a blessing and a sign of the love we have for the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

In this article, if you will permit me, I would also like to offer a personal anecdote that relates to the Gospel reading for today—the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand. It has been my experience for many years now that in my own life God often subjects me to the lessons I need to learn just prior to my reading or hearing them in Scripture. That way (I've surmised), I have the "Aha!" moment that makes the lesson real.

Case in point: Several years ago I accepted a position as Religious Education Director at a large suburban parish in the Buffalo Diocese. I assumed that role at a time when almost everyone who participated in that ministry had grown disillusioned with the previous leadership and decided they were not going to volunteer any longer. That left me with 800 students to catechize and only three catechists—and I only had one month before classes began. My assistant and I called, pleaded, begged, whined, made bulletin inserts, promised the world, and tried everything we could think of to attract catechists. We gained three or four more. I needed fifty. I cried to my assistant that I didn't know what I was going to do! I really didn't know what I was going to do! Fine! If Jesus wanted our children to be catechized, then he would just have to multiply the loaves and fishes! Fine!

Panicking, I asked my pastor if I could please speak at all three Masses to plead my case in person. He agreed, and I prepared a very persuasive (I thought) speech. That Saturday evening I walked into church and took my place near the ambo. Mass began, and when it came time for the Gospel reading...my pastor read the story of the *multiplication of the loaves and fishes!* Yes, it was that Sunday's Gospel reading, and I had no idea. And yes, I felt humbled and properly chastised. So much so, that I told my fellow parishioners that I had thrown out my prepared speech and that I stood before them just like the doubting disciples in the Gospel story. I shared with them why and asked if they would please consider volunteering to be a part of the miracle that Jesus Christ was about to perform in the Religious Education Department! Needless to say, by the time classes began, I had all fifty catechists and then some! I even had substitutes—leftovers, just as occurred in the Gospel story!

As I write this, I am humbled once again to remember the abundant love of Jesus, even in the face of our meager provisions. He takes our paltry offerings, and makes of them acceptable gifts to the Father. We are grateful, Jesus, for your very real presence, everywhere we find it.
