



Seeds for the Journey

As a Global Fellow with Catholic Relief Services, I have personally witnessed the work of CRS on behalf of our sisters and brothers around the world. I have listened to farmers, students, immigrant parents, and community leaders tell their stories about moving from poverty and despair to prosperity and hope. But one of the most moving experiences I have had, came from a woman I have never met.

During a trip to Uganda in January 2019, our delegation of Global Fellows met with a group of refugees and local community leaders in the refugee camp known as Bidibidi, one of the largest in the world. As we left the meeting and passed through one of the villages, on the way back to our vehicles, a strange motion caught my attention from the corner of my eye. At first, I thought it was an animal, a dog, or a goat, then I realized it was a woman. She was wearing a colorful dress, but she was walking on her hands and knees with her legs up in the air and crossed behind her. She appeared to be heading to her hut. Unfortunately, there was no time for us to stop and speak with her, so I don't know her real name; I call her Angelica. I spent the rest of the day thinking about her.

That night, I woke up from a sound sleep with the most vivid image of Angelica in my mind. It was as if she was in the room with me. For the rest of the night, thoughts of the humility, inhumanity, and indignity that she and the other people in that refugee camp experienced echoed through my mind. I prayed, I cried, I yelled at God: "These are human beings, made in your image," I said, "how can you allow such suffering?" Of course, I knew the answer to that question, as I suspect we all do. God does not deliberately cause human suffering, but human beings do.

To make a long story short, by the time the sun came up the next morning, another image had settled into my head, an image of Jesus, crawling on his hands and knees, alongside of Angelica. I saw that as a clear invitation to me to do the same. I don't know Angelica's real name; I never met her. But wherever I preach or speak on behalf of CRS, her image is with me, her voice speaks through me.

Angelica is more than a symbol, she is a living, breathing soul created in the image of God. She is also one of millions of people around the world whose lives have been changed by the efforts of CRS. Unfortunately, the recent termination of thousands of foreign assistance programs leaves people like Angelica and millions of others vulnerable due to hunger, malnutrition, and the lack of access to shelter, clean water, critical medical care, and more. Even if funding for foreign assistance is restored soon, it will take time for CRS and the communities it serves to recover. We can help!

By supporting CRS Rice Bowl and the annual Bishop's relief fund (on the 4th Sunday of Lent), you can make a significant difference in the lives of millions of people around the world. Over the past fifty years Rice Bowl has raised over \$350 million dollars to help support the work of CRS in over 120 countries, including the U.S., since 25% of our donations support the poor in our own diocese. CRS Rice Bowl not only provides for people's physical needs, but it also empowers communities to be agents of their own future, and most importantly offers people like Angelica dignity, self-respect, and hope for the future.

St. Paul's Elect

We have a Catechumen now Elect, going through the Order of Christian Initiation here at St Paul's. She will be baptized, receive her First Communion and her Confirmation here at St Paul's on Easter Vigil. Before that, she will do her Scrutinies for the next three weekends during Mass.

What are the Scrutinies? The Scrutinies are rites celebrated on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent by those preparing to be baptized at Easter known as 'The Elect.' They are described by the Church as 'rites for selfsearching and repentance, which are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weal, defective or sinful in the hearts of the Elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the Elect from the power of sin and Satan and to protect them against temptation and to give them strength in Christ who is the way the truth and the life. These rites therefore should complete the conversion of the Elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.' Let us join to pray for Kayla Thiel and support her as she takes this great step in completing her Christian Initiation.

St. Paul's Question of the Week

Question to the editor: Dear editor why is Lent 40 days long?

The number 40 is mentioned 146 times in the Bible. It generally symbolizes a period of testing, trial or probation.

In the Old Testament, Moses lived 40 years in Egypt and 40 years in the desert before God selected him to lead His people out of slavery. Moses was also on Mount Sinai for 40 days and nights, on two separate occasions (Exodus 24:18, 34:1-28), receiving God's laws. He also sent spies, for 40 days, to investigate the land God promised the Israelites as an inheritance (Numbers 13:25, 14:34). The prophet Jonah powerfully warned ancient Nineveh, for 40 days, that its destruction would come because of its many sins (Jonah 3:4).

In the New Testament we find the number 40 is significant in the life of Jesus: Jesus fasted 40 days and nights (Matthew 4:2); Jesus was tempted 40 days by Satan (Luke 4:2, Mark 1:13); Jesus remained on earth 40 days after Resurrection (Acts 1:3).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that because of the above, "by the solemn 40 days of Lent, the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert" (n. 540).


