

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Although most of us have received Covid-19 vaccines, we are still following CDC, NYS and Diocesan guidelines for best practices to keep everyone safe. We thank God that after a very challenging time, we are slowly regaining normalcy with some hope and renewal of life. So, in June you will not see me around because I will go to visit my relatives and friends in Texas and Georgia. I was hoping that I could visit my mom in Kenya to celebrate her 80th birthday this year but due to cases of coronavirus and US traveling warning, God willing I will visit her next year and then we can celebrate her 81st and my 60th birthdays.

Coronavirus came so quickly but the impact of challenges will remain with us for some time. In the seminary, I was never trained on how to handle a pandemic and this is true to most clergy. Hence, we had to suspend celebration of masses with the faithful. Parishioners were also scared to come and that means we lost fellowship. Some ministries like our Good Sam Outreach were paused despite this is the time many people needed help. Some people were grieving the loss of a business, job, investment, and enduring financial challenges. There are those whose relatives or friends became sick or even died from this virus or other causes.

"The global pandemic made us suddenly reflect on our own mortality and reminded us that we are not in control of all the variables in our lives, no matter how organized, hardworking, or well-qualified we might be. In addition, the disconnectedness many have felt during this time has reminded us that we are social beings, created for communion with one another." (A Pastoral Guide to Opening Your Parish, Page 15). There is no doubt that this pandemic made most of us think and reflect more on the mystery of suffering and death.

The History of Human Salvation has taught us that God can use suffering like those of Babylonian Exile and the Cross of Jesus for the greater good of His people. Of course, God is not the cause of coronavirus but can use this pandemic as means of purification, conversion, or renewal of our faith and recommitment to Him and the church. Fathers Ayre and Heinlein in their book *Finding Christ in the Crisis: What the Pandemic Can Teach Us* say, "The scandals of the clergy, the lukewarmness of faith, and so much more call us to repent. Might God be drawing us into a time of purification to recommit ourselves to the covenant and mission He has established in His Church?" (Page 25).

So, let us continue to reflect on these questions: What lesson God is teaching us? How do we return to Eucharistic celebrations with joy and thanksgiving? How will I adjust to new reality and letting go of some stuff? Do we have new ministries that need to be considered? Would you like to be involved in the new ways of doing our programs? What about parish financial support? I must say that I'm very grateful for your gifts and contributions during this challenging time. The first time in many years we have reached our CMA goal. Thanks to the parishioners who responded positively when I called requesting them to contribute for CMA Matching Campaign. Thanks very much for your continuing generous support.

Bethany House Wish List for May

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


