

Dillard, Annie Pilgrim at Tinker Creek

As we celebrate spring, this Pulitzer Prize-winning memoir would be a suitable companion. Annie Dillard seems to be simply describing a place called Tinker Creek. "It's a good place to live; there's lots to think about." But her observations lead her to profound philosophical and theological reflections. From the death of a frog to the rhythms of the creek to the secretive life of the muskrat, she sees the beauty and the terror and the intricacy of the universe. Like a modern-day Henry David Thoreau, she reminds us what it means to really see and to hear and to sense. With reverence for her material, she uses seemingly insignificant experiences as stepping stones to a deeper understanding of the world and our place in it. (Call No. 512.97-DIL)
