Seeds for the Journey

Last week we learned that over fifty doctors in India had recently died in a single day from the COVID-19 virus, bringing the death toll of doctors in India to over a thousand as of this writing. Currently India has the fastest growing positivity rate in the world and is second only to the U.S. in total cases.

As the death and positivity rates in the U.S. continue to decline, those numbers in many developing countries continue to increase, exacerbating the plight of those already suffering from conditions of poverty, unemployment, hunger and thirst. Sadly, while we in the U.S. argue over the wearing of masks and the efficacy of getting a vaccine, developing countries, where hospitals are overwhelmed and whole families are dying, are begging for the vaccines many here refuse to take.

While the plight of our sisters and brothers around the world may seem beyond our reach, one of the easiest and most effective things we can do to help is to advocate. Simply put, advocacy is the process of supporting a cause. With respect to an elected official, advocacy involves encouraging that individual to support or change a policy or write a new law. To that end, we can help our struggling sisters and brothers around the world by asking our elected officials to support poverty-reducing international development and humanitarian assistance in the Fiscal Year 2022 federal budget. Though it comprises only 0.5% of the federal budget, humanitarian assistance supports emergency relief (e.g., COVID-19) while also addressing the root causes of poverty, hunger, and forced migration.

Federal international humanitarian assistance is a major source of funding for organizations such as Catholic Relief Services. As a partner of the U.S. government in the application of international assistance CRS is currently working to improve the lives of 250 million people in over 100 countries. Moreover, CRS is actively working in 50 countries, including India, to alleviate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. These efforts include providing COVID awareness training; personal protective equipment; sanitation, hygiene, and medical supplies; mental health support for health care workers; and micro-financing loans that help businesses recover so that laborers can return to work and once again provide for the needs of their families. CRS is also helping to feed families by offering cash assistance to cover basic food needs, as well as take-home food rations for teachers and school children.

We can help our sisters and brothers around the world struggling with the effects of COVID-19 by advocating for humanitarian assistance in the Fiscal Year 2022 federal budget. One simple way to do that is by sending letters to our elected officials. This, in fact, was one of the projects of St. Paul's 2021 Confirmation class in which the students learned about Catholic Social Teaching, global poverty, and advocacy. The end result was a personal letter from each student to one of our Senators asking for support for international humanitarian assistance. We can all follow the example of these wonderful students.

So, you might be wondering, how do I write an advocacy letter? Well the answer is very simple, literally. Keep your letter brief, to the point, and respectful. After addressing your representative, identify yourself, your Catholic affiliation, and your purpose for writing, e.g., your concern for those suffering from poverty, hunger, etc., and the compounding effects of COVID-19. Follow this by asking support for poverty-reducing international development and humanitarian assistance in Fiscal Year 2022. Conclude your letter with a thank you for their attention to the issues you raised.






