



Seeds for the Journey

When We Sing – We Pray!

The choir is known as the "OK Chorale." (*Redneck Humor*) - Why do we need a choir in our Catholic Liturgy at all? It is a question that often floats through the air on the wings of song. At times the choir, within the congregation of the faithful and as part of it, will assume the role of leadership, while at other times it will retain its own distinctive ministry. Thus, a well-trained choir adds beauty and solemnity to the liturgy and also assists and encourages singing of the congregation. According to the apostle St. Paul (the namesake of our Church here in Webster) the faithful who gather together to await the Lord's coming are instructed to sing psalms, hymns and inspired songs (Col 3:16). We all know that participation in the Sacred Liturgy must be **internal**, in the sense that by it the faithful join their mind and especially their heart to what they pronounce or hear and cooperate with heavenly grace. Even when listening to the various prayers and readings of the Liturgy or singing of the choir, the assembly continues to **participate actively** as they unite themselves interiorly to what the ministers or choir sing, so that by listening to them they may raise their minds to God.

At other times, the choir alone will sing works whose musical demands enlist and challenge its competence so as to further lead the heart of the congregation to help interact with the word and work of God. Thus St. Augustine says rightly: "To sing belongs to lovers." We are lovers of our God! Choirs spend a lot of time and energy to be lovers of God and to help you move yourself in that direction. We still have too many of our congregations who do not sing to show their love of God.

In addition to its role in leading the singing of the lovers of God, the choir performs its ministry by singing alone. Appropriate times when the choir might commonly sing alone include a prelude before Mass, the entrance chant, the preparation of the gifts, an anthem during Communion procession or after the reception of Communion and the recessional. **Choir members**, like all liturgical ministers, exercise their ministry with evident faith and participate in the entire liturgical celebration, recognizing that they are **servants** of the liturgy and **members** of the gathered assembly.

Your choir here at St. Paul are "Lovers" and at the present are undergoing change. You may have noticed that our number of members are down. We have had people move from the parish and/or have put their service to different projects in the Parish. On behalf of the St. Paul Choir I am asking you to consider joining the Choir. If you have sung in the choir before, or maybe a high school or college choir, or a choir in another parish we would sincerely like to ask you in the words of St. Augustine to join our *Singing Lovers* in the service of God and the parish. It is hard work, but all of the members of the parish choir enjoy their work and service to the Parish. I would like to close the with some words of St. Augustine which reminds us of our pilgrimage: "You should sing as wayfarers do-sing but continue your journey. Do not be lazy, but sing to make your journey more enjoyable. Sing, but keep going." Please feel free to contact me or any member of the choir if you would like more information. But JOIN US please! The quality of our participation in such sung praise comes less from our vocal ability than from the desire of our hearts to sing together of our love for God. Remember, participation in the Sacred Liturgy both expresses and strengthens the faith that is in us. Barron, Bishop Robert Letter to a Suffering Church (A Bishop Speaks on the Sexual Abuse Crisis)

Bishop Barron, a lifelong Catholic, describes his book as a cry from the heart. The sexual abuse scandal has been for him, and for millions of Catholics, especially the victim-survivors, lacerating. He understands that his fellow Catholics are understandably demoralized, scandalized, angry beyond words, and ready to quit. But he urges his brothers and sisters in the Church to stay and fight on behalf of themselves and their families, and especially on behalf of those who have suffered. He believes there are many good reasons to criticize and be angry with the corruption, stupidity, cruelty, greed, and sexual misconduct of some of the leaders of the Church, but there is no good reason to leave the Church. No good reason to turn away from the grace of Christ in which eternal life is found. Stay and fight so that Christ will continue to be the light to the world. (Call No. 282-BAR; New)
