





1 month of CMA! One month and we have reached 40% of our goal!!!!! Thank you to the 145 families that have donated to help St. Paul's reach out \$100,000 goal. Last year we reached our goal because of these generous individuals that gave to the shortage.

While the CMA is a word we are used to hearing for 6 months a year at mass, I'm not sure everyone knows where the CMA money actually goes. Below is a breakdown the Diocese has shared in full trans-

9%	Serving people in need through Catholic Charities	The CMA provides a subsidy to Catholic Charities to support its regional offices/agencies throughout 12 counties serving the poor, elderly, infirm, and the most vulnerable in our communities.
34%	Providing diocesan- wide services to our parishes and institutions	The CMA provides funding and resources to assist parishes, pastors, staff, Pastoral councils, Finance Councils, ministers and chaplains in serving the faithful through Liturgical, Urban, Rural and Multicultural programs and ministries; Hospital and Jail Chaplaincy; Finance, Human Resources, Facilitie Management, Information Technology, Tribunal, Archives, Communication Stewardship and Pastoral Planning services.
7%	Supporting Seminarians, Deacons & Pastoral Leaders	Your donations to the CMA support the education and professional development of our seminarians, deacons and pastoral leaders.
5%	Educating our young in the Catholic Faith	The CMA helps prepare our youth for fulfilling and faith-centered lives through parish religious education programs, Catholic schools, campus ministry, sacramental preparation, CYO, young adult and youth ministry programs.
28%	Funding Operations & Support Services	The CMA helps to fund operation of diocesan offices/ministries in the Pastoral Center, including maintenance and capital improvements.
12%	Funding the Ministries of our Pope & Bishop	The CMA gives Catholics the opportunity to extend their reach beyond their parish boundaries to support Vatican ministries, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, New York State Catholic Conference, the work and efforts of Bishop Matano and the lay advisory councils that guide diocesan-wide decisions.
5%	Supporting the CMA Campaign	It costs 5g to raise \$1 for the CMA, well below the nonprofit industry average. A portion of funds raised through the CMA is used to develop and execute fundraising efforts associated with the Appeal, including professional expertise, staffing, gift and data processing, promotional materials and postage.


Thank you to all who helped to make this a wonderful way to honor many loved ones.

All are welcome to join us on Thursday, December 5 at 6:30 p.m. in the worship area. Our guest speaker, Fr. John Mack has a Masters degree in theology and a Licentiate of Sacred Theology (STL). He currently serves as the priest Chaplain of the Aquinas Institute. He has been ordained nearly 40 years for the Diocese of Buffalo. Retired from active ministry, he resides in his family home in Rochester, working part-time at Aguinas and occasionally helping at the Catholic Newman Community, University of Rochester. The past 15 years of ministry, Fr. Mack has participated in the initial priestly formation program for seminarians at Christ the King Seminary, East Aurora and Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology, Hales Corners, WI. He has taught in two Catholic High Schools and has twice served as a pastor in diocesan parishes. Fr. Mack is a liver transplant recipient (30 June 2020) from a living donor (former parishioner) and is a volunteer for the Friends of Strong Liver and Kidney Transplant patient visitors.

From the John Walsh Library

Martin, S.J., James <u>Learning to Pray</u> (A Guide for Everyone)

Father Martin admits his first way of praying was to ask for things. For an A on a test. To hit a homerun. For a puppy. The more he wanted something, the more Hail Marys he would say. There is nothing wrong about asking for things; it is human and natural. And using socalled rote prayers that have already been written like the Hail Mary is fine also. They are familiar and comforting. But there are so many additional ways to pray, so many practices, so much flexibility. This book is written for people of all faith traditions and for people with no strict faith traditions. He defines prayer as a conscious conversation with God, a close sharing between friends. He suggests that you first ask God to be with you and to help you. In prayer, you might express gratitude for the beauty you find in nature. You might really think about the words of one of the prayers you learned as a child. You might read and reflect on a sacred text. You might think of someone or something that inspires you. You might describe an emotion you are feeling—even anger. There are indeed so many ways to pray. There is no wrong way.

difference in the world.


Doctrinal Corner


