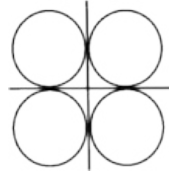



The names of your loved ones will be printed in the bulletin on the weekend of November 2nd and 3rd. We invite you to join us at a special Mass of Remembrance on All Souls Day, November 2nd at 10:00 a.m. A Rose to Remember will also be offered during our regularly scheduled weekend Masses on Saturday and Sunday. As you arrive for Mass your reserved rose will be in the Narthex. Once you check in with our volunteer the rose(s) you purchased will be set aside for during Mass. As the offertory gifts are brought forward each person that purchased a rose(s) will be invited to collect their rose(s) and process to the sanctuary where you will add your flower to one of the designated vases in remembrance of our loved ones.

At the conclusion of Mass you are welcome to take your rose home with you or leave them at St. Paul's.

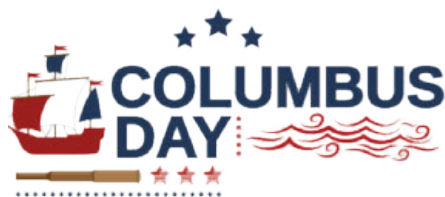

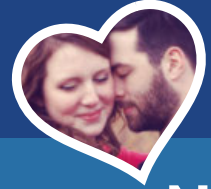

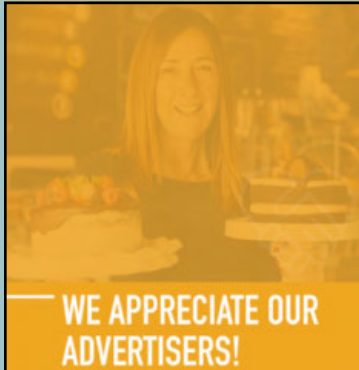
