



Greenberg, Vivian E. Your best is good enough (Aging Parents and Your Emotions)

As a clinical social worker, the author has often dealt with the intense frustrations and stresses of middleaged people who are caring for their aging parents. She provides practical strategies for coping with this stress, information on the needs of the elderly, the vital role emotional involvement plays in caregiving, and the need for assertive and honest communication with our parents. Using anecdotes and real-life cases, she explains how to realize and accept the limits of what we can do, how to get siblings to share responsibilities, and how to cope with the perennially difficult parent. Painful decisions must be made as adult children balance and sort out the critical variables that affect the caregiving situation. With compassion and warmth for both the caregiver and the aging parent, Ms. Greenberg makes it easier for families to relate her ideas to their own situation. Rosary Group




