



Grinnan, Jeanne Brinkman, Etal Sisters of the Thirteen Moons (Rituals Celebrating Women's Lives)

In the course of a year, the moon goes through its cycle of change thirteen times: new moon to crescent moon to full moon. A pattern of change occurs in women's lives as well: girl to adulthood to elderly woman. The rituals in this book celebrate these changes and developments, recognizing the significance of each stage in a woman's life. These celebrations were developed by the Prism Collective, a group of feminist educators and writers who create resources to make the world a safer and saner place for women. These celebrations can be shared as a group or read as individual meditations. They include music, readings, symbols, decorations, sharing, and prayer. The milestones celebrated range from welcoming a newborn girl to reclaiming the traditional bridal shower to the grieving of loss. (Call No.291.3-GRI)


