

Seeds for the Journey

Here is my semi annual update on what we are up to here in the office and buildings. We continue to be closed to visitors and stagger the staff in the office to reduce the amount of cleaning/disinfecting as well as limit exposure because each of us (or a family member) has underlying health conditions.

Unfortunately, no BBQ, picnic, or VBS this year. Instead we are working on in-house projects and getting ready for the fall. And Mass seat sign ups!

In the Church we now have votive candles on either side of the Blessed Virgin Mary. From the flickering lights we can see that more people are using this devotion each week. A reminder that the candles are reset each Friday.

Work is progressing on upgrading our video Mass streaming as well as making it possible to view the Readings, Creed, and Gloria during Mass from screens (since we removed the Gather books). It is taking a little longer than expected since we are trying to reuse some of our existing equipment (to save money) and our electrical system is old. However, the Diocesan IT department is advising us (and saving us more money.)

A small piece of asbestos was in such a position that we felt it was best to be removed before it caused a problem. We contracted to have that done.

Several dead elm trees on the edge of our property were a risk to the neighbors behind us if they fell. So we had them removed.

Mass seating continues to be a challenge. You may notice that the number of available seats varies from week to week. This is due to the size of the groups that sign up. Our highest attended mass (109) had multiple groups of four and five. Last week we were completely full Thursday morning at 102 because we had a lot of two and threes. Fewer people, but placing the chairs 6 feet apart takes up more room so we can't fit as many.


We monitor the sign ups and if the numbers are high (and with smaller groups) we start placing the chairs in Thursday afternoon (or earlier) to see if we can fit them and then adjust the available seats on the sign up accordingly.

We know it is not convenient for everyone to have to sign up each week and we appreciate your patience with our system. It has been suggested that we should just set up the seats with a fixed number of each group and do a "first come first served". But then we likely would be turning people away (or seating smaller groups in larger sets if that was all that was available) and more seats would go unused. Please know that we are doing our best with a challenging situation.

Finally, believe it or not, we just approved the 2021 envelope schedule, ordered the 2021 Calendar, and are looking at the Christmas mailings.


